General Membership Meeting September 4, 2018

Mike Jones, President of Board 102 called the meeting to order at 09:15 a.m.. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance after which the new member table was welcomed and reminded to stay after the meeting for a photo. The President welcomed the Elite Sponsors and thanked them for supporting NRC. He reminded the membership that forty-five to fifty percent of our revenue come from our raffles that are supported by the sponsors. The President asked the members to patronize our sponsors.

The President introduced our speaker, City of Cape Coral Mayor Joe Coviello.

The Mayor discussed the following topics:

- Water quality and the effect of the blue/green algae including measures that our city are or may try to implement
 - Ecological Lab in Cape Coral is presently in trials of micro lift bacteria in canals to kill nutrients that will kill algae
 - 0 Bubble curtain
 - Divinity beam curtain 0
- Bimini Basin
 - Large pipe under Cape Coral Parkway that was clogged has been opened. This is allowing water to flow into the basin and improving the water quality.
 - City is trying to gain more rigid control of boats anchoring in basin. Plans include addition of a mooring field.
- Street Scape-47th Terrace
 - Project completion is targeted for end of the year.
 - Mayor asked that we support the businesses in the construction area during the modernization. 0
- Old Golf Course
 - City has hired an environmental attorney who will help us move forward without subjecting the city to environmental issues.
- **Economic Development**
 - Three new car dealerships coming to city
 - Nor-Tech Boats is expanding 0
 - A beer garden is coming to the cape
 - Lucky's Grocery is opening a store on Veterans
 - Nathans has opened and Panera Bread will be opening new stores
- Housing Market
 - Strong and Steady
 - Cape Coral Tech is offering more trade classes to help ease shortfall in skilled workers
- Go Bond Bond supported Master Plan for Park and Recreation Department
 - More Pickleball courts
 - Expand existing parks
 - Upgrade Yacht Club boat ramp and beach.
 - Add a parking structure at Yacht Club
- Seven Islands Projects
 - Similar to Cape Harbour with hotel, condos, marina, restaurants and shops

The presentation was followed by a short question and answer session.

Steve Andresen (Activities Chair) gave an update on the following activities: Military Museum tour, Shoot Center, Edison Tour, and Cocktails on the Cape. Nora Hoover reminded everyone that Ladies Luncheon is the third Thursday of the month. This month the luncheon is at Dante's on Sept. 20 at noon. This is a pre-pay event. Marc Weitzenkorn (2nd VP) reported that the Dinner Dance is Sept 22nd. The theme is "Homecoming". Marc encouraged everyone to attend and to please sign up early. Mike Jones announced that Sept. 16 is wife appreciation day and to act accordingly. JoEllen Jones then asked membership to review August minutes. Date of August Minutes was corrected and Minutes were accepted. Treasurer John Stevens presented the July financial report. The report was accepted. See financial report in newsletter. John reiterated that the raffles and membership fees are our primary source of income.






