General Membership Meeting Minutes November 2018

New Resident Club of Cape Coral Monthly Minutes November 6, 2018

Kathy Bode, President of Board 103 called the meeting to order at 09:16 a.m. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mike Wasilak, a Vietnam Veteran.

Kathy Bode introduced herself as President of Board 103 and provided the membership her background. She is a graduate of the University of Minnesota with a degree in social work. She worked in adult probation and changed careers to IT. She retired in 2011 as the Chief Information Officer for the Department of Transportation for the State of Minnesota.

The President welcomed all attendees including the new members. She thanked her group, the Getgoes for supporting her at her first meeting.

The President introduced the first guest speaker, City Manager John Szerlag.

Mr. Szerlag gave detailed information about the city's growth including mentioning that we are now the ninth largest city (by population) in the state bypassing Tallahassee. Because the city is a pre-platted community, one of the biggest challenges is to raise the percentage of commercial and industrial companies to offset the residential tax base.

Other facts he shared included:

- The financial status of the city in now stable and sustainable
- The current budget is \$800M per year
- The city maintains 3000 lane miles of streets
- · The city has increased the number of streetlights focusing on school bus stops and common crash sites
- Seventh best place to retire in Florida
- Cape Coral has a 311 system for non-emergency inquiries
- · Cape Coral has a volunteer committee to train city volunteers
- On the Move newsletter mailed to each residence monthly

Mr. Szerlag identified the following challenges for the city:

- Water quality
- City is waiting for \$20M reimbursement from FEMA for damage associated with Hurricane Irma.
- Maintaining competitive tax rates on residential property

Mr. Szerlag discussed the following projects currently ongoing:

- Utility expansion program \$400M
- Seven Islands project, proposed groundbreaking 2019
- 47Th Terrace to be completed before the end of the year
- A major revision of the City Codes is in progress. Mr. Szerlag stated that this will be on the City Council's meeting agenda scheduled on November 26.

Mr. Szerlag then introduced Vincent Cautero, Community Development Director who gave an overview of the development plans for the Bimini Basin. Vincent discussed the proposed mooring field ordinance and the plan to further develop the basin.

Both presentations were followed by a short question and answer sessions.

Secretary Report: JoEllen Jones asked membership to review the October minutes. Copies were made available on each table. Minutes were accepted.

<u>Treasurers Report</u>: Fred Piecewicz presented the October financial report. The report was accepted.

Activities: All Chairpersons gave their monthly report on activities and updates. See Newlsetter for details.

<u>Toys for Tots:</u> Rick Robison thanked the members for bringing toys to their potlucks. Rick informed the membership that collection boxes will be at the next meeting or you can call him to arrange for a pickup.

<u>Turkey Drive for the Caring Center:</u> Kathy and Bob Bode will be at the Yacht Club parking lot on November 13th from 9:00 to 10:30 to collect your donation of a frozen turkey or \$10 Publix gift certificate.

New Member Introductions: Kathie Chaney welcomed the new members, invited them to the new members social and reminded them to report to the fountain after the meeting for a group picture.

The business portion of the meeting adjourned at 10:29.


