### **Greetings to All NRC and Gold Members**

As you know the NRC has been around for over 50 years. During that time there have been many changes to the constitution. As the years have passed boards have found that it is necessary to add or delete language that is needed or no longer necessary. For example, to help increase membership the last board changed membership from two years to three years.

In April, at the General Meeting you will be voting on the following proposed changes that Board 103 has approved.

### Article 1 - Membership

- Current language Membership shall be open to any new resident who has been a resident of Cape Coral for not more than three (3) years and is limited to a one-time enrollment of three (3) years.
- Adding language After 3 years members become non-voting members and are not eligible to hold office.

### Article 1 - Membership

Removed one time open enrollment

Article III - Officers and Executive Committee

#### Section I

- Current Language No Officer may serve more than two terms on the NRC Board
- Proposed language No Officer may serve more than three terms on the NRC Board

Article V - Meetings

### Section 2

• Adding language - If a vote is to be taken only those members who are within the 3 year enrollment period are eligible to vote.


