General Membership Meeting May 7, 2019

Jeff Pollack President of Board 104 called the meeting to order at 09:15 a.m.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance. The pledge was led by Mike Raikowski , a new member and veteran who served in the Vietnam War from 1963 to 1967.

Jeff introduced Joe Coviello, Mayor of Cape Coral, providing the membership with the Mayor's background.

Mayor Coviello discussed the following important topics:

Water Quality

Mayor Coviello, in concert with mayors from six other cities, formed a coalition to work with the Southwest Water Management Board to control water released from Lake O. They have been successful in getting the Corps of Engineers to increase the water flow during the dry season to lower the lake level which will allow less outflow during the wet season. The lake is now at its lowest level. This will lessen outflow during the rainy season. The outflow in rainy season is a major contributor to the creation of algae.

The committee has identified that 2100 non-compliant septic tanks in North Fort Myers are contributing to adding pollutants to the river. The county is working on this issue.

Fort Myers currently releases 100,000 pounds of nutrients into the river. A grant of 3 Million dollars has been awarded to build a pipeline from Fort Myers to Cape Coral. Cape Coral will further treat the water prior to it being released.

Cape Coral has been awarded a grant to build a gun range for the police department for training purposes.

The Gold Bond (\$60 M) was approved and working is being started on improving the park system as identified in the bond proposal. This includes renovations at the Yacht Club.

A new economic development director has been hired by the city to focus on increasing the commercial tax base.

The four corners development will be 15 units per acre instead of the 25 unit per acre that the developers had requested.

The Mayor stated that as the city is growing rapidly, infrastructure needs to expand. The City has hired six new fire fighters and will be building a new fire station.

The Mayor explained that the State of Florida changed the laws regarding Police in the schools. The City is now responsible for supplying 26 resource officers in local schools. The City is hiring new officers to replace those officers resigned from other duties to the schools.

The City has received benches from non-profit organization to be placed at bus stops in an attempt to increase safety for the children.

A questions and answer session followed the Mayor's presentation.

Jeff welcomed the new members and asked that they go to the fountain after the meeting for pictures.

Jeff asked for a show of hands for those members who would be in Cape Coral throughout the summer. Jeff asked them to share any ideas for events with the new board.

Jeff asked everyone to purchase raffle tickets and reminded all that signup sheets for events are at the back of the room.

Secretary's Report: JoEllen Jones, as stand in for Traci Chepeus, presented the minutes. The minutes were accepted as presented.

Treasurer's Report: Fred Piecewitz filling in for Rick Robison presented the financials to date.

Activities: Daniela Fergen presented activities for the month. Tickets are still available for the Murder Mystery Dinner at the Broadway Palm Theater. See website for further details.

Ladies Luncheon: Colleen Carty gave details for the Ladies Luncheon at the Redfish Point Garden Bar & Grille . See website for further details.

Dance: Kevin Marshall asked for band suggestions for future dances.

1st VP Don Vuncannon reminded membership to bring items for the Caring Center to the general meeting and the dances. Forty new members signed up this month. They will be combined with the April group.

Jeff then introduced the remaining Board Members and the Men's Breakfast Chair, Chris Weeks and had them describe their job responsibilities.

Don Vuncannon introduced the new members. New members were reminded to meet out front for photos.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:18 am and was followed by the raffles.

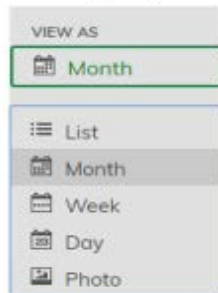

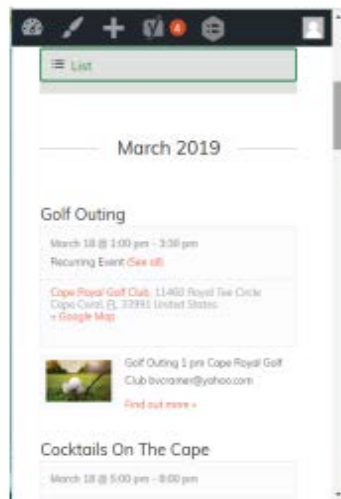
