### **General Membership Meeting August 6, 2019**

Jeff Pollack, President of Board 104, called the meeting to order at 9:20 a.m.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance and was led by veteran, Dan Dame, who was a commanding officer in the US Marine Corps, and fought in Vietnam.

Jeff thanked the NRC members for great attendance at 22 activities in July, and for the 210 members who attended the BBQ/Dance. He mentioned that we'll be having a magician and comedian at future activities in September and October.

Rick Robison stated that member graduations hadn't occurred yet this year, June – August were missed. These will be caught up in September.

Jeff welcomed the new members and asked that they go to the fountain after the meeting for pictures. Jeff announced the raffles close at 9:30.

Jeff stated that there were a few proposed changes to the constitution, that had been approved by the board. He presented a proposed change that would allow for a president to serve 2 terms, as opposed to the current one term. Written documentation of the proposed changes will be sent to all members to read, ahead of the anticipated vote in October. Jeff also announced that if the change for the president's term was approved, he would be running for a second term. Gary Eldred, past president – board 99, and Frank Catanese – board 97, addressed the membership to state their thoughts against the changes to the constitution. After some discussion and questions from the audience, the topic was ended, and is to be continued at the September meeting.

Secretary's Report: Traci Chepeus presented the minutes. The minutes were accepted as presented.

Treasurer's Report: Rick Robison provided the financials, they were accepted as presented.

Jeff welcomed guest speaker, Dr. Andrew Kurtz, Music & Executive Director of the Gulf Coast Symphony. Dr. Kurtz is the founding director of the orchestra, which is in its 23rd year. Dr. Kurtz is an avid arts educator, and has directed both nationally and internationally. Dr. Kurtz has lived in Florida for 25 years.

- The Gulf Coast Symphony is the largest community orchestra in the US. It is recognized for its high-quality performances, community involvement, and commitment to education of the arts.
- They play 14-16 performances each year at the Barbara B Mann in Fort Myers. The summer pops concerts are held July August, to serve the people who live and work in SW Florida year round.
- They also have ten performances every year in Cape Coral.
- They will be performing on 2/16/2020, at the Taste of the Cape, which will be held at Tarpon Point.
- The Symphony performs many different musical genres including broadway, opera, ballet, rock and roll, and jazz.
- The Symphony participates in an after school program, called Music Works, which provides music education and instruction for the children. They also work with college graduates to prepare them for a career in the arts. The program is part of a larger program at The Heights Center in Harlem Heights.
- Dr. Kurtz has the responsibility to grow the roster of musicians for the orchestra. There are currently 100 members, who are all volunteers, and range in ages 14-89.
- Dr. Kurtz said information about volunteering to play for the orchestra, as well as other volunteer opportunities including administrative and marketing, can be found on the website.
- To receive information from the Symphony, go to the website and sign up to join their mailing list. This is also a way to receive advance notice of upcoming concerts.

Due to time constraints, the presentation by Patrick Wood and Wally Hartauer, regarding the Beach/Boat Club was moved to the September meeting.

Dance: Lori Kezer discussed the luau theme for the dance, and asked for volunteers to help decorate on August 24 - contact Jeff or Lori of your interest. Steve Andresen stated that Mel's Diner will be providing a tropical themed dinner.

1st VP Don Vuncannon stated that 17 new members joined today, and he introduced them. Don also stated that the newest NRC group picked the name Tropical Transplants.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:27 a.m. and was followed by the raffles.




