

GREETINGS TO ALL NRC AND GOLD MEMBERS

On May 7th of this past year, I wrote my first message here with excitement, enthusiasm and apprehension in becoming your President. I talked about the many challenges we would have this summer but with assistance from my fellow board members, I believe we reached our goal of having the best summer that the NRC has seen in a long time. I'm not sure why I was so blessed having such a progressively thinking board, but each and every one of the Board members brought a fresh approach to standards that have been around for 53 years. We had many events that were sell-outs and we even added a few that were never on the calendar. For the summer months, we had extraordinary dance attendance including a July dance that had 210 members show up. Food at the dances was much fresher this term as the caterers we had working with PM Refreshments, understood that the food needed to be prepared in the Yacht Club kitchens for our guests. We started some new clubs this summer. Most notably, the Photography Club that currently has over 40 members. For our incoming new members, Hospitality made them feel glad they joined the NRC. Breakfast at the General Meeting improved 10-fold. Raffles made money for the club as did the Ladies Luncheon which always was a sellout. Our officers, led by Vice President 1, Vice President 2, our Treasurer and Secretary, kept me in line and always had the right reasons for things they suggested. Our Newsletter was very creative and was informative. Dances and Activities went off with very few issues each month due to our Directors hard work. I leave this office with the utmost respect for all of Board 104 and thank them for their friendship and support during the last 6 months.

I also wrote in my first Presidential message that we will only be as strong as our membership is. I asked the membership to "help us help you" and all of you came up with ideas and suggestions that we tried to institute this summer. IT WORKED! The Members of the NRC are the reason we had a successful summer. You all attended as many events as you could and apparently you all had a great time. A big thank you goes out to all our members for helping us be as successful as we were.

Success isn't just measured by the events we attended. Board 104, with one month to go and not including the September Dance or Magic Show figures, showed an overall profit for the NRC as of October 1st. We had expectations of the summer being a little slower due to the snowbirds being gone, but we still had a busy, exciting and profitable summer.

In closing, I would like to thank my Board and the NRC Members for the honor of serving you as your President for Board 104. It's an experience I will always remember with fondness.



General Membership Meeting September 5, 2019

Don Vuncannon, 1st President of Board 104, called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance and was led by veteran, Ted Clark. Don thanked Cindy Wasilak and her team for the breakfast set up. Don welcomed the new members and asked that they go to the fountain after the meeting for pictures. Secretary's Report: Traci Chepeus presented revised minutes from the August meeting, changing the last part of the section on the proposed constitutional changes to reflect: There was discussion and questions from the audience. Jimmy Fitzgerald made a motion to quash the proposed constitutional changes, it was seconded by Bob Bode. A hand vote carried the motion to quash the proposed constitutional changes. The topic was ended for the meeting, and the proposed changes will be presented at the September meeting, per Robert's Rules of Order. Copies of the revised minutes were on tables for reference. The revised minutes were approved and seconded. Traci acknowledged that there has been a lot of conversations and some concerns in regard to the proposed constitutional changes. She reviewed the changes and stated that Board 104 did approve the changes by a majority vote, though not unanimous vote. The vote would then go to the membership in October.

Traci then turned the meeting over to Rick Robison. Jimmy Fitzgerald and Bob Bode made several points of order related to Jimmy's motion in August to "squash" the vote. Rick stated that after sending the question to the Roberts Rules of Order for response, the Roberts commission ruled that the motion to "kill" a vote can only happen on the day of the vote and thus Jimmy's motion only related to any votes being made in August. Rick then made his thoughts that he was against the changes and made a motion to postpone the vote indefinitely, which Traci seconded. Before a vote could be called Bob Bode delayed the vote by caling a Point of Order. He and Jimmy again spoke. It was noted that Jimmy's motion was entered into the minutes and that another motion was made to suspend the vote indefinitely. Rick then made a motion to postpone the vote for the constitutional changes indefinitely. Traci, and several others, seconded the motion. Don asked for a vote by the membership, and the vote passed. There was also a show of hands for members who were active, and those who were gold members. After the vote there were questions to clarify what delay indefinitely meant. It was explained that indefinitely meant that a future board would have to take upthe motion and present it to the membership again. It was clarified there would be no vote on the constitutional changes in October. Treasurer's Report: Rick Robison provided the financials; they were accepted as presented. There was a question around the timing of deposits related to Ladies Lunch Raffle and the Dance. Rick stated that the monies were deposited on July 31st, however due to timing the bank did not recognize them until August 1st.

Don welcomed guest speaker, Karl Steidinger, Exec Director, Midwest Food Bank FL Division. Midwest Food bank is a nonprofit organization, in Fort Myers. They serve Cape Coral too. The organization was founded in Bloomington, IL in 2003. They started out small, in a garage, and now have eight locations. Karl spoke about emergency relief efforts, which started in 2005 with Hurricane Katrina and then with Hurricane Michael in 2018, they delivered truck loads of food and cleaning supplies to those in næd. They will also be delivering supplies to go to the Bahamas by sea, for those impacted by Hurricane Dorian. Midwest Food Bank serves several organizations in Cape Coral, including the Caring Center (which is the biggest), Cape Coral Boot Straps, and Eagle Rising to name a few. They now have a new mobile pantry too. All food is free. Food distribution day is on Tuesdays. The organization partners with several large corporations and also accepts private donations. Karl stated that a \$1 donation = \$33 in value. Midwest Food Bank has three full time employees, and rely on their volunteers. For information on volunteering, go to midwest foodbank.org.

Don introduced Richard Cavello, from the Cape Coral Police Volunteer Unit (PVU). The PVU is looking for volunteers for patrd, administration, and marine. Volunteers need to be over 21, have a valid FL driver's license, and live in Lee Co. Volunteers are expected to serve 16 hours per month. The next academy will be held November 11-15. Richard said that volunteers are priceless, and have saved the city \$1.3M in expenses.

Candidates for Board 105 were introduced by Don: OFFICERS- President: Latitia Schnobrich, 1st VP: Don Vuncannon, 2nd VP: Lori Kezer, Secretary: Paula Miller, Treasurer: Ed Pearsal. DIRECTORS- Hospitality: Karen Kierstead-Lane, Activities: Dani Fergen, Newsletter: Sondra Johnson, Dance Reservations: Sarah Pruitt, AM Refreshments: Teresa English & Joan Conochan, PM Refreshments: Sue Campbell, Ladies Luncheon: JoAnne Craig, Photo Historian: Susan Oliver, Raffles: Sandy Zaper, Publicity: Open, Board Advisors: To be determined. The vote for the new board will be held at the October General meeting. The new board will be introduced at the October dance, and will take office on November 1st.

Don Vuncannon recognized the graduates from June, July, and August: Margarita Madness, Paradise Parrots, and Bad Buoys—Nauti Gulls. Mary Vuncannon stated that 40 new members joined today, and introduced them. The meeting was adjourned at 10:14 a.m. and was followed by the raffles.
