## General Membership Meeting October 1, 2019

Jeff Pollack, President of Board 104, called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m.

The meeting began with Jeff re-introducing Board 104, and those that assisted the Board. He thanked them all for their service. The Pledge of Allegiance was then led by Board 104.

Jeff welcomed the new members and asked that they go to the fountain after the meeting for pictures.

Secretary's Report: Traci Chepeus presented the minutes from the September meeting, which were accepted and seconded.

Treasurer's Report: Rick Robison provided the financials, and stated that the summer Board ended in the black. The financials were accepted as presented.

Jeff introduced Comedian R.C. Smith, who will be performing at the Big Blue on October 13th. R.C. gave the members a taste of the comedy that will be at the show later this month.

Jeff introduced the Keynote Speaker, Joseph LeMay, who is a Claims Specialist with the Social Security Administration. He lives in Cape Coral, and has been with the SSA for 10 years.

-Joseph mentioned that "my Social Security account" can be accessed on the web; a retirement estimator is available. The website is: [www.ssa.gov](http://www.ssa.gov).

-Windfall Elimination Provision – discussion around how working with the state/government can impact what social security will pay out to an individual.

-Spouse Benefits and Government Pension Offset was discussed.

-Survivor Benefits – in the event of death, a person would lose the lesser of the two benefits (individual or spouse).

-Divorced Spouse Benefits – If you were married 10 years, you are entitled to file against a previous spouse. This has no effect on the current spouse or your individual benefits. However, if the divorced spouse who is collecting gets remarried, then they lose the benefits of their previous spouse.

-Social Security is a "social program", which means monies go to a general fund to pay for everyone.

- Medicare was discussed at a high level. Part A is hospital, which you don't pay premiums for if you collect/file for social security. Part B is provider/doctor, which has a standard premium of \$135.50. An individual's income will impact the premium paid, there is a 2 year look back period at tax records.

-Income Taxes – social security monetary benefits need to be reported, a 1099 will be provided.

Activities: Daniela Fergen presented activities for the month, which included a haunted walking tour. See website for further details.

Rick Robison stated that the Gulf Coast Symphony will be performing Dvorak Symphony No. 9 on November 16, and Deck the Halls concert on December 8.

Toys for Tots – Toys will be collected at meetings and the dance. 2/3 of the toys stay in Cape Coral, and 1/3 stay in Lee County.

Ladies Luncheon: Colleen Carty gave details for the Ladies Luncheon at Duvall's.

Dance: Don Vuncannon discussed the Halloween theme for the dance, and Shore Patrol will be the band.

Don Vuncannon stated that 44 new members joined today. And the newest group picked the name Canal Cruisers. Don introduced the new members.

Cindy Wasilak, AM Refreshments, thanked all those who helped her over the past 6 months.

Blood Drive: Barbara Walters stated that there will be a blood drive on October 16.

Jeff Pollack introduced the slate of officers / directors for Board 105. A motion was made and seconded to accept the proposed slate. Jeff asked for a hand vote to accept the new Board, the vote carried.
