NRC Board Position Descriptions

The NRC needs

AONiii

President

Prepare the agenda for and facilitate the monthly General Meeting and Board Meeting. Arrange the programs and obtain speakers for monthly General Meeting. Utilize webmail to promote community events and update all members of the NRC on a regular basis. Preside at all business meetings and oversee duties of all board positions. Act as Spokesperson for the Club. Sign Bank Account signature cards.

1st Vice President

Enroll new members at the monthly General Meeting. Attend Socials and give orientation for new members. Maintain database of new and graduating members. Attend new group's first potluck dinner, assisting them in getting off to a great start. Lead Nominating Committee. Responsible for reviewing applications for positions on the next NRC Board. Present the Nominating Committee's selections for next term to the NRC members.

2nd Vice President

Host the monthly NRC dinner/dance. Secure music and entertainment for dinner/dance. Ensure that all entertainment contracts are signed by the President. Responsible for developing themes for dances, acquiring decorations, decorating the dinner/dance location, arranging table centerpieces and keeping inventory of decorating materials.

Secretary

Take the minutes of all General Meetings and all Board Meetings. Make copies of the previous month's minutes of the General Meeting and distribute copies to members prior to commencement of the meeting. Email previous month's Board Meeting minutes to Board Members. Type any general correspondence necessary. Add all minutes, invitation fliers, thank you notes, and new member lists to NRC binder.

Treasurer

Collect all funds due the NRC and pay all bills authorized by the Board. Keep a record of all transactions and maintain checking account. Prepare monthly income and expense report for monthly General and Board Meetings. Signs bank account signature card.

AM Refreshment Chairperson

Pick up all groceries, coffee cake, fruit, etc. and paper products as needed before the General Meeting. Responsible for setting up tables with paper products, snacks, coffee, tea, etc. Supervise your volunteers/assistants at the General Meetings. Keep records and receipts of all transactions and submit to Treasurer for reimbursement

PM Refreshment Chairperson

Select and work with the caterer to ensure success at the dinner/dance. Create menus that work with the theme of the dinner/dance. Purchase sodas, wine, beer, and paper products for the dinner/dance. Replenish drink supply and ice as necessary during the dinner/dance. Assist in clean-up after the dinner/dance.

Publicity Chairperson

Responsible for all NRC press releases and monthly announcements in conjunction with the President. Submit announcements to News-Press and Cape Coral Breeze each month or as needed. Attend weekly Saturday Farmers Markets. Organize staff for Sunset Celebration table. Place NRC information at Chamber of Commerce and other venues that are frequented by new residents. Find new avenues to advertise New Resident club.

Raffle Chairperson

Solicit Cape Coral merchants for raffle prizes to be used for NRC members and giveaways for "Welcome Packages" for new members. Collect funds from purchase of raffle tickets. Prepare envelopes for disbursing money and prizes for raffle drawings. Conduct the prize and 50/50 or 25/50 raffles at the monthly General Meetings and Dinner Dances. Send "Thank You" notes to merchants. Update "Thank You" section of the Newsletter monthly.

Activity Chairperson

Coordinate at least one large group activity for the NRC each month. Coordinate "Cocktails on the Cape". Set up "Activities Table" at General Meeting. Announce activities at General Meeting. Relay information/announcements to President for transmittal to the membership.

Newsletter Chairperson

Responsible for the monthly publication of the New Resident Club's newsletter. Notify interested parties and board members of the deadline each month. Create dinner/dance flier. Send electronic file to publisher one week before General Meeting. Email newsletter file to the webmaster. (Program and template are provided)

Hospitality Chairperson

Host the monthly Social for new members. Purchase beverages and food for the Social. Submit receipts for reimbursement by the Treasurer. Communicate with 1st Vice President as to the number of confirmed responses. Assist with the decorations for monthly dinner/dance on Saturday morning (the forth Saturday of the month

Dance Reservation Chairperson

Take reservations for monthly dinner/dance over the phone, via email, and in person during the General Meeting. Distribute the sign-up sheets to the "drop-off" locations and pick up the sheets and checks on Monday before the dinner/dance. Collect all monies for dinner/dance. Setup floor plan and table arrangements and provide them to the Yacht Club on the Wednesday prior to the dinner/dance (4th Saturday of the month). Assist with decorating and cleaning up after the dinner/dance. The number of reservations is relayed to the PM Refreshments Chairperson.

Photo Historian

Take photographs at the General Meeting, the dinner/dance, "Cocktails on the Cape", Men's Breakfast, Ladies Luncheon, and the New Member Social. Take pictures at other activities as requested/available. Submit photos to <u>Shutterfly</u>. Send photo of new members (taken after the General Meeting) to the Newsletter Editor. Create/update album and scrapbook for Cape Coral Historical Society. (Requires computer access and/or flash drive, internet and camera)

Ladies Luncheon

Schedule Ladies' Luncheon with a Cape Coral restaurant that can accommodate 80-150 women each month. Negotiate the price of lunch and menu choices with the manager/owner of the restaurants. Submit copy of the event to the Newsletter Editor for publication. Take reservations for luncheon at the General Meeting, via email and by phone. Purchase raffle items. Sell raffle tickets prior to luncheon. Conduct raffle after lunch. Pay restaurant.

To all Board Members: It is strongly recommended that you attend the following monthly events:

1st Tuesday of the month - General meeting and Board meeting

4th Saturday of the month - Monthly dinner dance, help set up and/or clean-up


