As we begin this month to celebrate the 55th anniversary of the New Resident's Club, one may wonder how it all begin. In 1965, Helen Peck and her husband Milfred purchased a home in Cape Coral, known as the "waterfront wonderland with more canals than the City of Venice, Italy." The developers, the Rosen Brothers, tasked their Marketing Director Paul Sanborn to find ways to entertain the residents of the growing development. The local hotel agreed to allow the local kids access to their pool once or twice a week, and Sanborn started holding potluck dinners at the Yacht Club. The residents started looking forward to these events and as the neighborhoods continued to grow, so did their friendships.

Helen Peck could see these potlucks as an opportunity for something more, and she had ideas of what that might look like. So she would visit Sanborn at his office several times during the week. Sanborn finally decided that Peck needed something to do, so he convinced her into taking over the potlucks. So take over she did, and decided that there could be something more than just the potlucks. In 1967 the New Resident Club of Cape Coral ("NRC") was organized. The constitution she helped create is still at the core of all the club does. Peck envisioned that the NRC would "give newcomers the opportunity to exchange ideas and form friendships".

Here we are fifty-five year later, the potlucks are the same as they were in 1967, but they are now held in members' homes, at local parks and restaurants. The NRC is stronger than ever, even going through difficult times in the last two years and having to move from the Yacht Club to the Lake Kennedy Center.

Unfortunately, Helen and Milfred Peck are no longer with us. I wonder if Helen ever realized what an impact that she would have on so many lives. It's difficult with every move, leaving family and friends behind; how wonderful it is to be a part of the NRC. This month we say thank you to one special lady, Helen Peck, and toast our beautiful friendships that have been created because of Helen.

As part of the celebration, you don't want to miss the September Dinner Dance on Saturday September 17th. I'm excited that Dennis Pastorelle was able to negotiate hiring the band "Peace of Woodstock". They are a popular group that pays tribute to "1969" as the greatest year in rock music. Caterer Extraordinaire will again caterer the dinner. So come join us in celebrating NRC's 55th anniversary, as the band takes us back to that great year, and don't forget your tie dye shirts, headbands and your peace signs.

Welcome to our new group "Ship Faced". Please sure to welcome them to the NRC Family.






