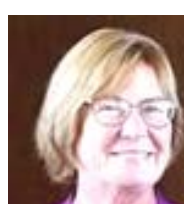

One of our members, Joann Wheaton has moved to Texas to be with her family. We wish her well.

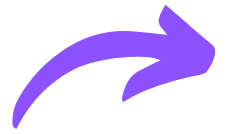
