We are a really busy and cohesive group and our social calendar is amazing.



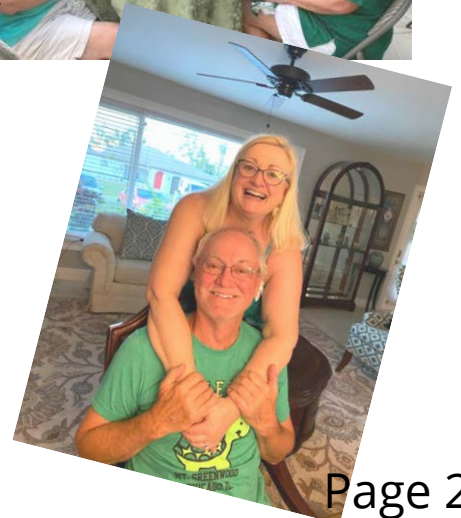
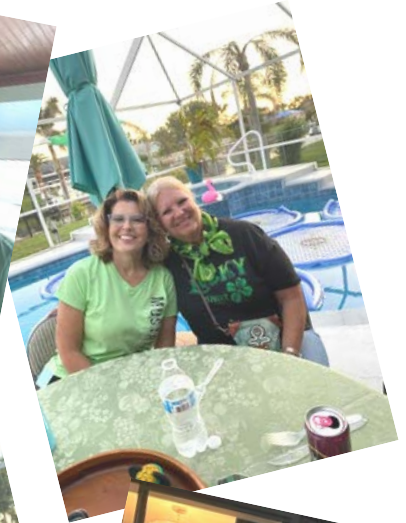

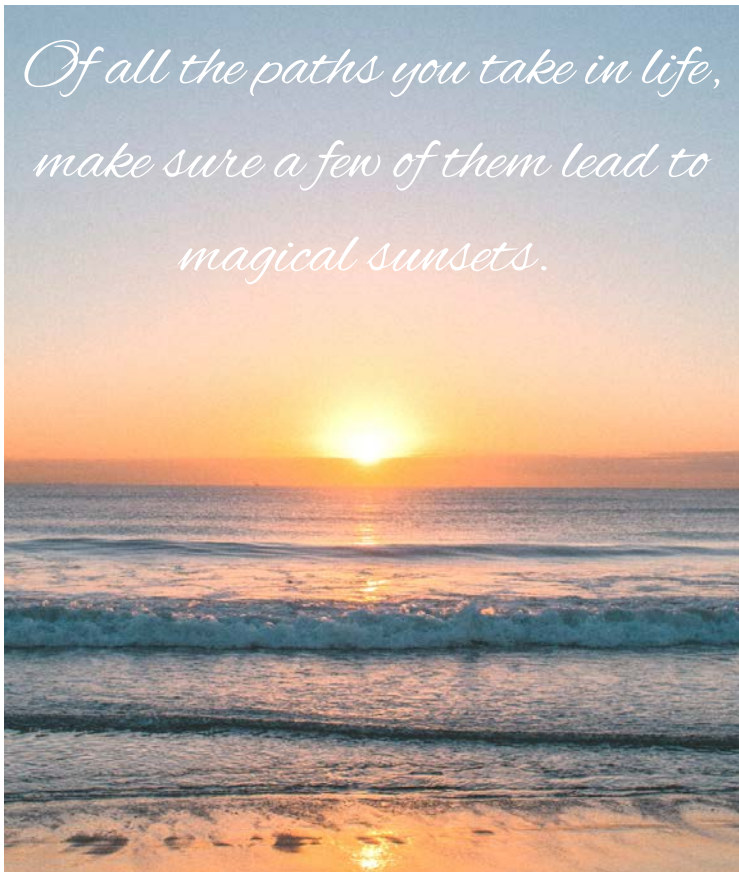
After three years, you will become a non-voting lifetime member of the NRC. A General Meeting is held monthly at the Lake Kennedy Center.
