

General Membership Meeting July 3,





Mike Jones, President of Board 102 called the meeting to order at 09:21 a.m.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The new member table was welcomed and reminded to stay after the meeting for a photo.

The President introduced the speakers, Fire Chief Ryan Lamb and Fire Emergency Management Division Manager, Dr. Jesse Spearo.

Chief Lamb provided an overview of the services of the Fire Department. The FD covers an area of 120 square miles. The FD has a response time of 8 minutes from the time a 911 call is received until they arrive at the scene. They have a hazmat and dive teams. They do 21,000 calls a year. They have both a Basic Life Support and an Advanced Life Support unit at every station. They also provide public assistance. Currently they are working on better technology in order to better serve the City.

Dr Spearo discussed that the hurricane season is from June 1 thru November 30. Most activity is August and September. Everyone should have a "Go Kit" and know the zone they live in case of evacuation orders. If the winds reach 39 mph there is no bridge traffic allowed. There is only one shelter in Cape Coral, Island Coast High School. Palm Beach county has surplus shelter space. Dr. Spearo also discussed the community volunteer programs. He introduced the CERT members of NRC and encouraged everyone to take the eight-week CERT course. During the hurricane season the best source of information is www.leeeoc.com

Both presentations were followed by a short question and answer session.

Nora reminded the membership that she has Ariani's discount cards. Blood Drive: Barbara Walter informed the membership that the next Blood drive is August 15 at the Yacht Club.

<u>Dinner Dance:</u> Marc Weitzenkorn reported that the Dinner Dance is August 25th. The theme is Venice with Palm Trees. The band is Riverside. Marc encouraged everyone to attend.

Secretary Report: JoEllen Jones asked membership to review July minutes. Minutes were accepted without correction.




NRC FAQ
