

The meeting was adjourned at 10:30am.

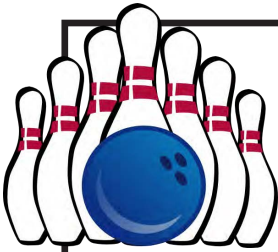

- Some survivors migrated to Cuba, Mexico, and Louisiana when the Spanish ceded Florida to England.
- Today, the only federally recognized tribes in Florida are the Seminole and the Miccosukee, 4,000 in number.

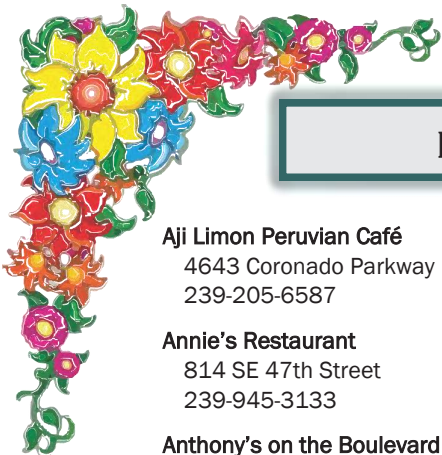

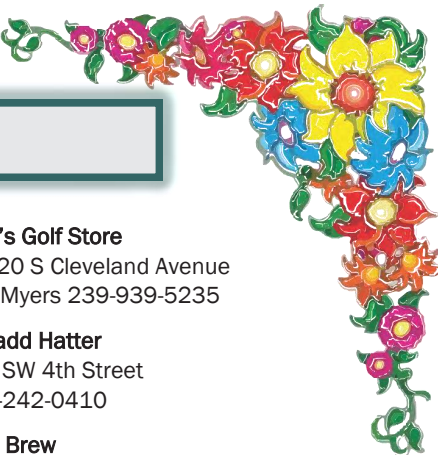

A. The term first appeared in 1858 in cricket, to describe H. H. Stephenson's taking three wickets with three consecutive deliveries. Fans held a collection for Stephenson, and presented him with a hat bought with the proceeds. The term was used in print for the first time in 1865, and was eventually adopted by many other sports including hockey, soccer, and water polo.

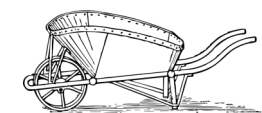

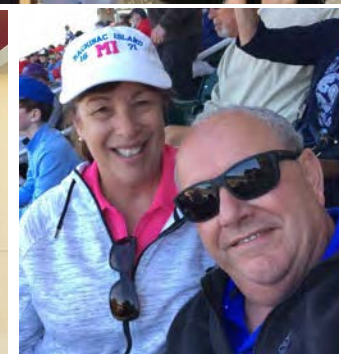
