





This clan is not only social and committed, we love (I mean love) to dine out whenever possible. So, as any addict focused on their obsession, 13 of the group dined at one of Cape Coral's newest restaurants, Time to Eat Mediterrean Cuisine on Del Prado Boulevard. Opening nearly 3 months ago, this native Italian chef brought his talents westward from Miami where he mastered his culinary skills and now venturing out on his own culinary adventure. Our group was the first to arrive for evening cuisine but within minutes, other curiosity seeking patrons arrived and began to fill the room. Appetizers came out quickly as our waiter, Billy, had his hands full quickly but juggled from table to table to serve our needs. Alas, the main courses arrived front and center. Salmon, scallops, fettucine and likes of Mediterranean faire, were ripely delicious. Several of us partook in a lively dessert of coconut cream crepes. Best wishes to owner, Chef Adrien Meizoso, as this venue continues to arouse its awareness amongst restaurateurs. Our ladies luncheon was held on Thursday, June 25th at Island Café in Matlacha. What a wonderful dining experience overlooking the Matlacha Pass from the patio. The café opened this past February and has become a local's favorite. Unique to the menu is the "broasted fish sandwich". I recall broasted chicken from up north; the chef uses a pressure cooker in lieu of a deep fryer. This method produces significantly less oil to the finished product.

And boy is it good. So next time you're out visiting the Matlacha shops or heading out to Pine Island, stop by for some good eats! It was also great having Karen back from her daughter's in Texas and the likes of Marge and Marla. (Marla mother's was our special guest today – glad to have her join us.) We've missed you ladies, hope to see you again soon. But now Angela is off to Massachusetts until the end of August. Hurry back! Looks like we're thinking Slate's for our July dinner activity.
