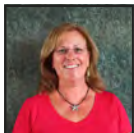

Thanks for the chance to give back to the club. I hope to exceed all your expectations!

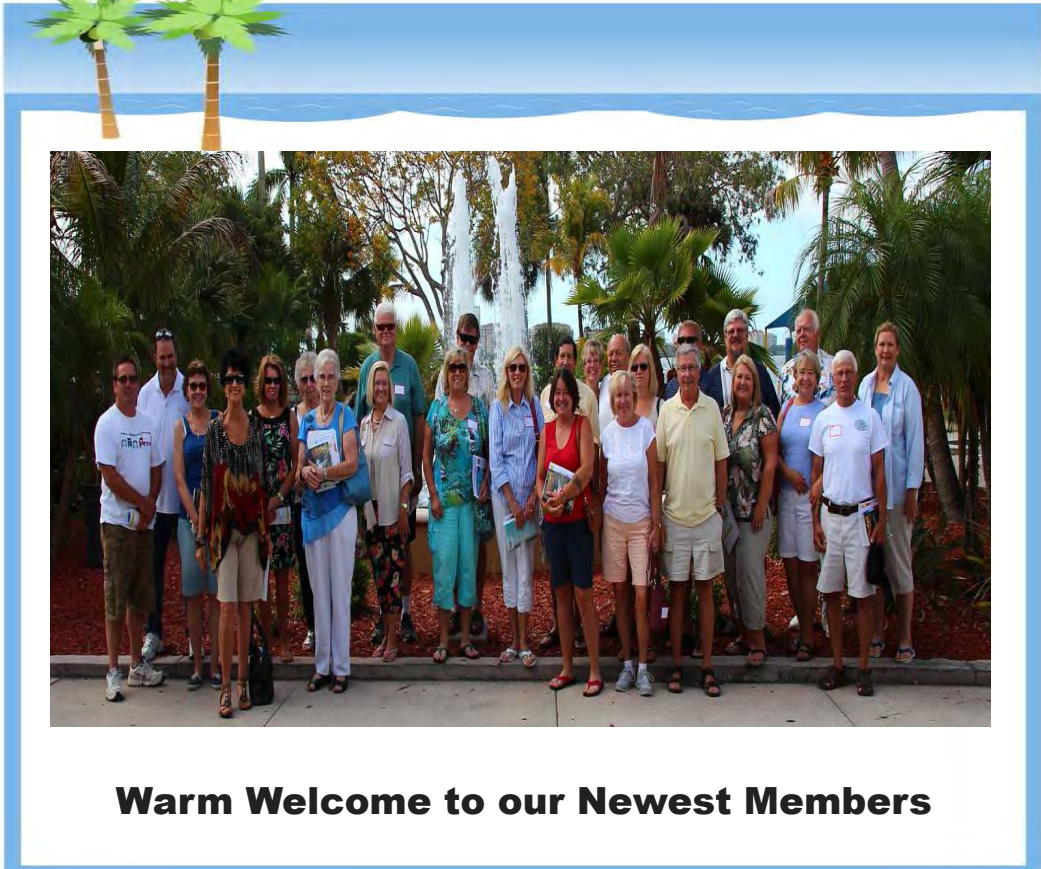
