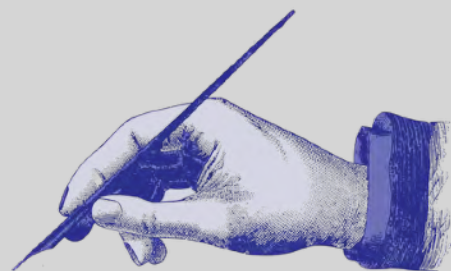

**General Membership Meeting, April 3, 2018**

## It's Time to Start Thinking About Hurricane Preparedness

Jim Farrell, WINK News Chief Meteorologist, will be speaking at the July NRC General Meeting and he always has a wealth of information on how best to be ready for the worst that might happen. With Hurricane Irma fresh in our memories, and the after-effects of Hurricane Maria still in the news, we all know it is better to plan in advance than to try to figure things out at the last minute. Here are a few things to think about as the 2018 season approaches:

- In the event of a mandatory evacuation, do you know the recommended evacuation route for your area?
- Where will you go if forced to evacuate? When a hurricane is heading your way, it's too late to make reservations and plans.
- How can you best secure your house, your boat, and your other belongings in the event of a major storm? Do you have storm shutters? If so, do you know how to put them up? Do you have all the hardware you need?
- If you have pets, where will you take them and how will you travel? Many shelters do not allow pets.
- Have you thought about what you need to take with you if you leave, and what items you will need to have on hand if you elect to stay?

### Interesting Facts About the Month of May

- May takes its name from Maia, the Greek goddess of fertility
- The May Day holiday (May 1st) started out as a pagan celebration dedicated to Flora, Roman goddess of fertility (and flowers, hence "May flowers")
- No month in any given year ever starts or ends on the same day of the week as May
- May was once considered to be the bad luck month for weddings
- A ship captain's or pilot's call of "MAYDAY!" is derived from the French contraction "m'aidez", which literally means "Help me."

## 2018 Cardboard Boat Regatta

Each year the NRC fields an entry in the Cardboard Boat Regatta, one of the premier events of the year. The Cardboard Boat Regatta began in 1994 with a single entry, sponsored by the Nauti-Skippers Boat Club. Since 2005 the event has been sponsored by the Rotary Club of Cape Coral and has grown to include many boats of diverse and inventive design, ranging from single paddler dugouts up to elaborate team-paddled contraptions that boggle the mind. Thousands of people attend the event each year, enjoying food, drink, music, and, of course, the races themselves. The regatta is held in Bimini Basin in the Southeast Cape.

In 2018, the regatta was planned for April 21st. Unfortunately, it had to be canceled due to concerns about water quality in the basin. The city has plans in place to address the issues, and the regatta will return in 2019. Most of the boats built for the 2018 regatta will return for the 2019 event.

The NRC team entry is the frequent winner of the People's Choice award, and this year's boat was quite elaborate, as usual. Since you won't be able to see it race until next year, here are some pictures of the NRC team's hard work. Yes, that train is entirely made of cardboard and paper, and a cardboard boat is hidden inside. Be sure to attend the regatta next year to see it in action!



We have all heard and read about water conditions in the Bimini Basin. The maximum allowable level of Enterococci bacteria in water is 71 parts per 100 milliliters of marine water. Local news media reports of test results show water from Bimini Basin reached over 1,900 parts per 100 milliliters!

The city of Cape Coral has recently taken steps to begin cleaning up the basin. People living on their boats in the Basin have been forced to leave. The City is checking for any leaking sewer pipes. They are aware and addressing issues.

Currently there are no mooring laws in place to regulate who and how long boats can moor in Bimini Basin. There is a proposal to address this issue.
