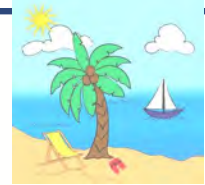

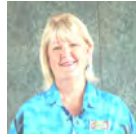

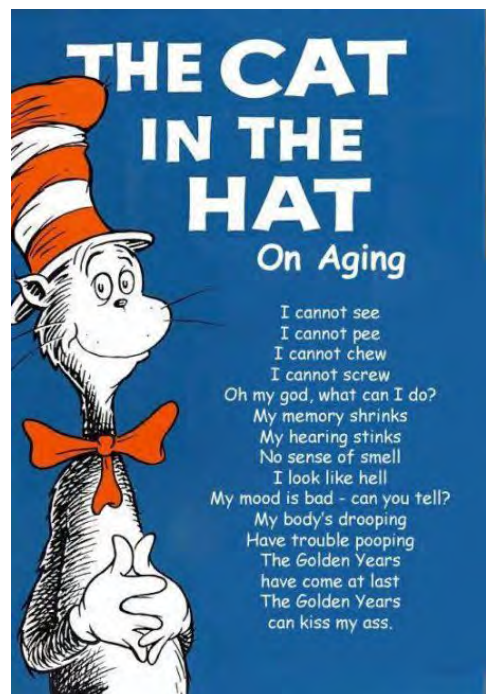

It's August with amazing sunrises and sunsets, mountains of clouds hanging in the horizon and our normal subtropical weather finally kicked in. 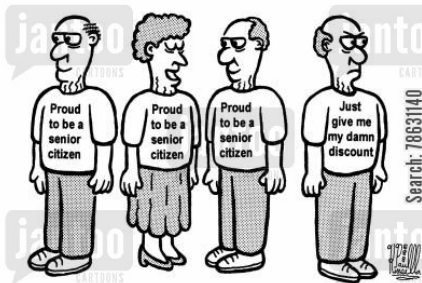
