GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS



Guest Speaker at the Last General Membership Meeting August 1, 2017

Jesse Spearo, PhD, Division Manager of Fire Emergency Management, Cape Coral Fire Department, spoke on issues of emergency response pertinent to Southwest Florida in general and Cape Coral in particular. While hurricanes tend to get the headlines, we are more likely to be affected by several other types of destructive natural events: severe rains, lightning, heat, wildfires, and tornadoes. Thus, we should be concerned with preparation year-round. During the six-month "hurricane off-season," Cape Coral's city government is especially busy with planning and organizing safety measures for home, family, and community. The key to minimizing the impact of destructive natural events is education and knowledgeable preparation. This includes knowing the "evacuation zone" assigned to your residence, having a pre-determined destination in the event of a community evacuation, knowing your evacuation route, and having a "go bag" pre-packed with essential supplies and records. Dr. Spearo distributed copies of the city's "All Hazards Guide" publication (available online at www.LeeEOC.com) and described the conditions under which an evacuation order is issued. He spoke about the availability of emergency shelters, to include one at the North Fort Myers High School, which is unusual because it permits pets (dogs, cats, birds). Downloading the smartphone application, "Ping4Alerts," was recommended as essential for receiving immediate local emergency alerts and critical news. Dr. Spearo made a pitch for the Cape Coral Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program, certified by FEMA and conducted by the Cape Coral Fire Department. CERT trains citizen volunteers with an eight-week curriculum of skills for emergency situations. The Cape's CERT program is top-ranked in the US, and is available upon application. In closing, Dr. Spearo stressed the importance of complying with a city-issued evacuation order in the event of a weather emergency: "I can't tell you where to go, but I can tell you where not to be."

DID YOU KNOW?

- Ruby-throated hummingbirds migrate from Central America to SW Florida for the summer
- During migration they can fly 500 miles nonstop, spending up to 22 hours in the air.
- Hummingbirds do not migrate or live in flocks.
- Males are first to arrive, in March. Females follow about two weeks later.
- Nesting begins in April.
- Males are also the first to leave, by the end of October.
 Females follow, again about two weeks later.
- Some hummingbirds stay here year-round—the lazy ones (or maybe the retirees).





Donors are also asked to use forms available from Nusser to record the item's value, description, and the group or individual making the donation.

The silent auction will begin as soon as the doors open for the dance at about 6 pm, and will close at 8:30 pm. Successful bidders will be announced by 9 pm. Winners must pay by cash or check; credit cards cannot be accepted.

Silent auctions have proved successful and exciting elsewhere, and the NRC is hoping for similar success with this venture.



There are additional groups that have been formed within the named groups.


